- Create Your Network ID/Password to Access myWSU**
The myWSU system allows you to access student records and conduct business with WSU online. You will use this system to register for classes, check your financial aid status, and pay your tuition. Be sure to view important notices that WSU sends so you should access the system often.

- Check Your Financial Aid Status (if applicable)**
If you have applied for financial aid you can check your status through myWSU. After logging in with your Network ID and password, click on "Finances" to view your award summary, to do list, and student account activity.

- Setup a WSU Vancouver E-mail Account**
Even though you may already have an e-mail account, we strongly advise that you establish an account with the University. Doing so will reduce the potential of viruses and will significantly improve your submission time for lengthy homework assignments. Attachments are often slow in getting to their destination on overworked servers. Use your WSU Vancouver e-mail account for university related business!

- I.D. Card**
Registration is required before a WSU student I.D. card will be issued
I.D. cards are necessary for various campus transactions including using the computer lab, the library and to use the printers on campus. There is no charge for the I.D. card. After you receive your I.D. card, you may add money to it to use the printing and/or copying services on campus, as well as in the cafeteria, Bookie and other campus locations.
