

WSU VANCOUVER TUITION & FEES – FALL 2009

The credit hours listed in this table are for fee purposes only. Full-time enrollment for academic purposes (including financial aid, private health insurance, etc.) is 12 credit hours per semester for undergraduate students and 10 credit hours per semester for graduate students. Students enrolling in more than 18 credit hours pay an additional fee for each credit hour over 18.

LATE REGISTRATION

- ◆ \$25 late registration fee will be charged to you if you enroll between August 24 and September 4.
- ◆ \$100 late registration fee will be added to your bill if you enroll September 7 or later.

CANCELLATION OF ENROLLMENT REFUND POLICY *(Pending revisions in governmental regulations may affect this policy after publication.)*

- ◆ Tuition, operating, and student services and activities fees will be refunded in full, *minus a 5% administrative fee*, if you officially cancel your enrollment (withdraw from **all** WSU classes) **prior to the sixth day of classes** for fall semester. If your official cancellation occurs **on or after** August 31, 2009, the following refund schedule will apply:

- ◆ An administrative fee of 5% of the assessed tuition and mandatory fees, or \$100 (whichever is less), will be charged for any cancellation after the semester begins. Other amounts you owe for benefits or services you received will also be charged.
- ◆ If you have the optional student medical insurance, you must come to the Student Services Center and cancel it **before the published deadline (September 4, 2009)** or you will be liable for the premium.
- ◆ Adjustments or refunds for students who receive financial aid will be computed on a modified schedule provided by the Federal Financial Aid Office.

DISENROLLMENT FOR NON-PAYMENT

- ◆ If you have an unpaid tuition and mandatory fee balance at the end of the semester you will be disenrolled from all your classes.
- ◆ No grades will be recorded on your transcript until **all tuition and fees have been paid in full**.

FEE ADJUSTMENT

- ◆ After the drop deadline (September 22) you will NOT receive an adjustment in tuition if you withdraw from a course. The withdrawn course will still be used to calculate fees. For example, if you enroll in 16 credit hours, withdraw after the fourth week from a 3-credit course and add a 3-credit course you are accountable for 19 hours and owe for the 1 hour over 18. Full refunds of the additional per credit hour charges (for each credit over 18) are given if your credit load is reduced to 18 hours or fewer within the first 30 calendar days of the semester (by September 22). Similarly, if you drop from 6 credits to 3 credits after September 22 you will NOT receive a refund for the 3 credits dropped.
